- Security screen doors****
- Security door locks
- Security window locks
- Sensor lights
- Peephole in front door
- Solid core door and hardware
- Rekeying of locks
- Window screens (now being approved for high-risk situations only due to cost implications)
- Security camera (for high-risk situations only due to cost implications)

****Security screen doors are consistently the highest cost across all regions in Tasmania with window screens significantly lower but still the second highest cost.
