Attachment A – Tasmania Prison Service and correctional officer, lockdown and assault statistics and information

Question I from Member of Parliament

For the period I January-31 March, 2023 the number and the percentage of shifts performed by correctional officers as an overtime shift.

Response from Tasmania Prison Service

The Tasmania Prison Service (TPS) does not hold data that is easily collated on the number and the percentage of shifts performed by correctional officers as an overtime shift. In order to collate the information, information would need to be manually derived from several systems for each facility, including disposition sheets, TimeFiler and other documents. As such, it would take a number of weeks to undertake this manual process. Staff are transferred between facilities when required to cover overtime and the TPS do not maintain records of what is not covered in TimeFiler.

Question 2 from Member of Parliament

For the period I January-31 March, 2023 the number and the percentage of shifts that could not be filled or fully staffed by correctional officers.

Response from Tasmania Prison Service

As abovementioned in the response for question I, the TPS does not maintain data for the number and the percentage of shifts that could not be filled or fully staffed by correctional officers. However, the TPS is able to provide data in hours for each roster period which covers all facilities – see "Attachment B".

Question 3 from Member of Parliament

For the period I January-31 March, 2023 the number of times there has been a lock down, the type and the duration of the lock down(s).

Response from Tasmania Prison Service

The TPS maintains record of prisoner's time out of cell for internal and national reporting requirements (see: Australia Government Productivity Commissions "Report on Government Services" - https://www.pc.gov.au/ongoing/report-on-government-services).

The reporting framework for capturing this information is complex due to the differing operations of the six prison facilities, and the individual operations of units within each prison facility. In regards to the reporting of lockdowns, this information is captured either by prison (for smaller facilities i.e. reception prisons) or by units / areas within larger facilities. On any given day, a number of lockdowns may be required, across a single unit, part population of a unit, or for a facility. Lockdowns can vary greatly in length of time, for example a late unlock of a unit / area by minutes / hours, to a full morning / afternoon lockdown, or a full day lockdown.

The reporting of lockdowns as per this request, is complex and would require significant clarification on the data. As an example, the Risdon Prison Complex is broken up into eleven reporting units/areas for the purposes of capturing time out of cell and lockdown information, and therefore if the facility is experiencing staff shortages, multiple lockdowns

would most likely be recorded. The level of staff shortage may impact whether all units/areas are locked down, whether they are all locked down at one time, or whether they are rotationally locked down across the day (for various periods of time). As another example, an unexpected medical escort would most likely not require a lockdown of a full prison, but may only impact one or two units where the staff are re-deployed from.

The data below has been manually collated from a review of lockdown data to provide the number of times the full population of a prison facility/precinct has been locked down for a full day.

Question 4 from Member of Parliament

Response from Tasmania Prison Service

Assault data is categorised in accordance with the national counting rules for the Australian Government Productivity Commissions "Report on Government Services" https://www.pc.gov.au/ongoing/report-on-government-services. To ensure accuracy of data, the assault data is still being reconciled for March 2023. As such the below is provided for January and February only.

Counting rules

Assaults are measured by the number of victims, not the number of attackers or incidents.

The data is broken down into three categories of assault according to the seriousness of the event; Serious assaults, Assaults and Other assaults:

Serious assault is defined as one requiring overnight hospitalisation, ongoing medical treatment or any sexual assault. Additionally, injuries that result in fractures, stitches or broken teeth are automatically classified as "serious".

Assault is defined as an act of physical violence resulting in physical injuries (which may or may not require medical treatment).

Other assault is defined as an act of physical violence that did not result in physical injuries or require any form of medical treatment.
