Your Submission to the TPC Review: I write to make a submission to the review of the Tasmanian Planning Commission. I strongly object to this draft Major Projects Legislation. It will give the Planning Minister unchecked power to declare any developments as a major project to be fast tracked for approval by a Development Assessment Panel.
