Examples of the special/individual conditions magistrates have ordered as part of home detention sentences

Examples of special conditions that have been imposed include:

- *You must not consume alcohol and when directed to do so by a police officer, probation officer or prescribed officer, submit to a breath test, urine test, or other test, for the presence of alcohol.*
- *You must not take any illicit or prohibited substances.*
- *Immediately upon your release from Court, you must attend the Community Corrections office at [location] for induction onto this order.*
- *You must, during the operational period of the order, maintain in operating condition an active mobile phone service, provide the contact details to Community Corrections and be accessible for contact through this device at all times.*
- *You must take medication as required by a psychiatrist or a medical practitioner or by another person specified by the court.*
